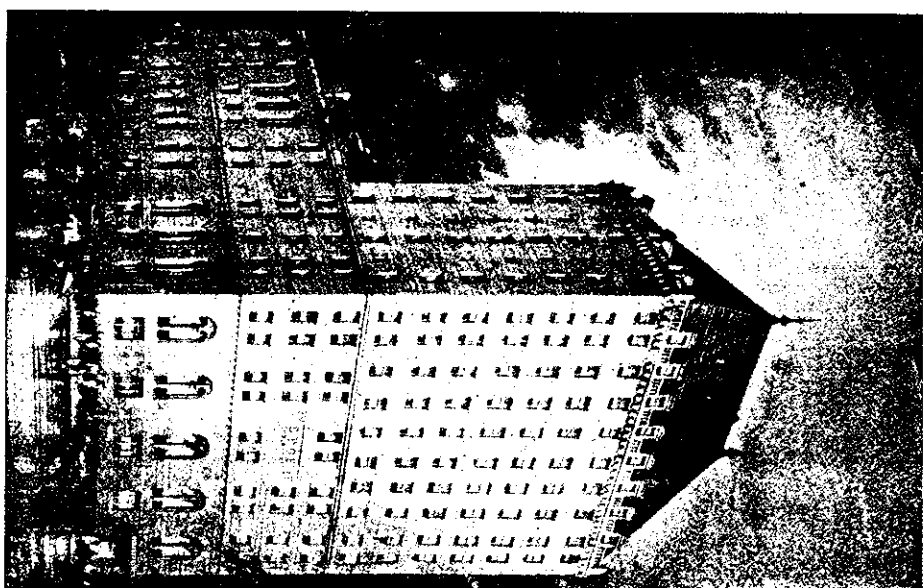

WHEN this issue of the Bulletin reaches the members, the final arrangements for our participation in the Reunion parade in Jersey City, on June 7th, will have been completed, and the members will have but one or two days within which to arrange to join with the rest of the members.

NOTES OF THE MEETING

Bro. Harry B. O'Connell, one of the most popular Sheriffs that Essex County ever had, and a member of Newark Lodge paid us a visit last Tuesday night.

The Grand Lodge laws permit subordinate Lodges to eliminate all meetings but one in the months of June, July and August. By motion, our Lodge decided to conduct meetings on the 3rd, 10th, 17th and 24th of June, on the 15th of July, and on the 12th of August, eliminating all others. The four meetings in June were thought advisable because of the great number of applications in the hands of the Investigating Committees, which it is hoped to dispose of during these meetings. The Lodge will probably initiate as often as possible in order to reduce the great number on the waiting list.

The Committee was received with a great amount of enthusiasm, and at its request a recess of ten minutes was called during Good of the Order. And it is worthy of note, that practically every newly made member immediately made arrangements to enter the parade. Practically all the older members who had not previously signified their intention to parade also signed up.
